PLEASE NOTE THERE IS NO PARKING AVAILABLE IN OR AROUND THE CASTLE GROUNDS

The Mayor will lead a civic procession with units of HM Forces and Service organisations from Shrewsbury Castle. The procession will leave the Castle at approx. 10.20 am following the route of Castle Gates, Castle Street, Pride Hill, Mardol Head and St John's Hill to The Quarry. The procession will be led by music from Shrewsbury Brass Band.

A Memorial Service will take place in the Quarry at the War Memorial at 10.45 am, Buglers will sound Last Post, which will be followed by two minutes' silence and Reveille, after which wreaths will be laid.

On conclusion of wreath-laying the Mayoral party will move to the saluting Dias on St Chad's Terrace, following which there will be a march-past and salute. Military Units and Organisations will march from the Quarry main gates towards Murivance towards Town Walls.

Those guests wishing to parade join the parade to the Quarry are requested to arrive at the Castle, Shrewsbury from 10.00 am.

The Mayor, Deputy Mayor and Town Clerk will assemble in the Mayor's Room to robe.

The Circular Room will be available for robing for the following:

Sword & Macebearers, Past Mayors and Freemen

Please note that although robes will be made available for those attending, we will not be able to offer any assistance with dressing. Following disrobing we would ask that you repack your robe and regalia into your named bag before dispersing. These bags will be left unopened for 72 hours before being tidied away and placed back in the Mayoral store.

As ventilation and space in the Circular Room is limited, once robed we would request that guests make their way outside promptly.

Aldermen, Magistrates, Members and Officers of the Council and representatives of the various organisations and societies are asked to assemble in the Castle grounds where they will be lined up under the direction of the Civic Parade Marshal.

Senior Dignitaries, namely Senior Military Officers, HM Coroner, MP and Senior Representatives of Police, Fire and Ambulance if present, are requested to assemble on the sloped path to the left side of the building. The Deputy Lord Lieutenant, The High Sheriff & the Chairman of Shropshire Council are invited to join the Mayor in the Mayor's Room.

Sword and Macebearers will line up outside the Mayor's Room.

The Military Units led by the Band will move off.

The Civic Parade Marshal will assemble the Civic Procession which will follow the Military Units.

On arrival at the Quarry the Military and Service Organisations will take up position under the direction of the **Military Parade Commander**.

Shrewsbury Brass Band shall take up their position on St Chad's Church Car Park.

The remainder of the Parade will halt briefly on St Chad's Terrace. The **Civic Parade Marshal** shall lead the following into the Quarry to be assisted into position by Shrewsbury Town Council staff:

10.52 am Memorial Service

10.58:50 am Bugler sounds Last Post and during this the standards will dip. Officers and Warrant Officers salute for the duration of the Last Post only. Male civilians remove hats.

11.00 am Two minutes silence

11.02 am Reveille is sounded. Standards return to upright position. Civilians replace hats.

11.04 am The wreath laying will commence and wreath will be laid in the following order:

1. The Lord Lieutenant 2. The Mayor 3. The High Sheriff 4. **Chairman of Shropshire Council** 5. **Senior Officer RN** 6. **Senior Officer Army**)together 7. **Senior Officer RAF** Officer Commanding D (Shropshire Yeomanry) Squadron, RY 8. 9. Officer Commanding E COMPANY 8 RIFLES)together **Member of Parliament** 10. **President Shrewsbury Royal British Legion** 11. 12. Police Fire Service 13.) together **Ambulance Service** 14.

The Mayoral Party will lay their wreaths on the Memorial itself, inside the railings. The remainder, under the co-ordination of the **Civic Parade Marshal** will then, in pairs, place their wreaths on the hooks positioned on the railings and return to their positions.

When the wreath laying is completed the Padre will say prayers and give The Dismissal and the Mayoral Party will move off led by the Macebearers in the order they arrived at the War Memorial. The Standard Bearers will then move to forming up positions for the March Past on the Parade Commander's word of command. The Parade Commander will then signal the Civic Parade Marshal who will move to lead off the Civic Procession to the saluting base on St. Chad's Terrace.

MARCH PAST


Once the Civic Procession are in position at the saluting Dias the Military detachments will step off from the Quarry in Column of Route. Veterans and Cadets will fall in behind, Civilian Organisations fall in behind Cadets.

The Parade will take the direction from the main Quarry gates towards Murivance. The salute will be taken by the Mayor on the right.

On arrival at Murivance all Detachments will disengage and disperse under their own arrangements.

After the March Past has been completed the Senior Military Officers will take leave of the Mayor at the Saluting Dais

The Mayor, Deputy Mayor, Past Mayors, Freemen, Town Clerk, Swordbearer and Macebearers will then disrobe in St Chad's Church Hall (tbc).
